## How to Make the Mini-Books

Follow these steps to copy and put together the mini-books:

- 1** Remove the mini-book pages along the perforated lines. Make a double-sided copy on 8½-by-11-inch paper.
- 2** Cut the page in half along the solid line.
- 3** Place page 2 behind the title page.
- 4** Fold the pages in half along the dotted line. Check to be sure that the pages are in the proper order, and then staple them together along the book's spine.

NOTE: If you cannot make double-sided copies, you can photocopy single-sided copies of each page, cut apart the mini-book pages, and stack them together in order, with the title page on top. Staple the pages together along the left-hand side.



Through multiple experiences with on-level books, children will be able to practice and develop a network of critical reading strategies, including:

- ★ predicting what will happen next in the story
- ★ understanding characters and their motivations
- ★ noticing the language patterns and style of the text
- ★ figuring out unfamiliar words by using decoding skills to sound out words and context clues to confirm word meanings
- ★ returning to the text to confirm understanding
- ★ connecting the text to other stories and their own lives
- ★ forming and communicating opinions about the books they read.



With this essential skill set in place, children are empowered to ascend the reading ladder with increased agility, gradually mastering more difficult titles over time—until the sky's the limit! And while fluency doesn't happen instantly, with systematic exposure to the right books, it does happen.
